

# Grievance Process for Enduring Earth Initiatives at The Pew Charitable Trusts

## About this process

The grievance process provides a way for parties to report a grievance (complaint) about a negative impact involving Pew and to seek a resolution. Pew uses this grievance process to collect and resolve grievances from anyone negatively affected by Pew's work in an Enduring Earth initiative, including in the NWT: Our Land for the Future PFP, SINAA PFP, Omushkego Wahkohtowin PFP, Panama PFP, Botswana PFP, and Eastern Tropical Pacific durable finance mechanism.

This mechanism is not meant to replace community-level conflict resolution processes that may be available. This mechanism is specific to Pew-related grievances. #### What will happen when I report a grievance?

The grievance will be reviewed so that together, you and Pew may find a suitable resolution. Pew has an internal process to review and address all eligible grievances while respecting the complainant and avoiding conflicts of interest.

#### Nonretaliation

Pew does not condone any form of retaliation against those who report their concerns in good faith. Any Pew employee or contractor who engages in such retaliation may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination of employment. Anyone who has made a good faith report of suspicious conduct of a Pew employee and who subsequently believes he or she has been subjected to retaliation of any kind should immediately report it by the same process noted herein.
